

GETTING ON THE BALLOT



Candidates qualify through the nomination and primary processes

ABSENTEE VOTING

Municipal clerks send absentee ballots to voters who request them. Voters vote them and mail or otherwise return them to the clerk's office.

CLERK

IN-PERSON ABSENTEE VOTING

Beginning 14 days before the election, voters may go to the municipal clerk's office to request, vote, and submit their absentee ballots.

CHECKING THE BALLOT

County clerks submit their ballot templates to the Wisconsin Elections Commission for review.



A BALLOT IS BORN


Approved ballots go to print.

ALLOTS

Ballots are delivered to counties who distribute them to the municipalities.

Day are counted. This may take a while in large municipalities, so unofficial results based on ballot count for large elections may not be posted until the following day.

SECURED & VERIFIED

Once counted, voted ballots are secured by the municipal clerk's office and submitted to the county for another round of counting & verification before storing them for the amount of time required by state statute.
